Dear Canopy Community,




Canopy's Outreach program spans several different categories: Scholarships/Financial Aid, Field Trips, Community Events, and Performing Arts

PERFORMING ARTS

The two Repertory Company shows collaborated with different artists to create immersive multimedia shows featuring live music by Libbaloops, original paintings by Laura Floyd, and original graphics by Amy Fleming. The fall Repertory Company performance also hosted a sensory-friendly show for the first time in studio history.

Canopy also hosted multiple opportunities for students to perform, including the adult student showcase, the advanced student show, teen & children's program shows and in-class recitals, and 3 open mic nights.











We added a new apparatus to the schedule - flying pole - and hired another full-time teacher to the staff.

Continuing education takes many forms at Canopy, and in 2024 we welcomed Erin Ball and Maxime Beauregard for teacher training focusing on Disability and Accessiblity in Circus Arts. Additionally, Ann, Mary Jessica, and Ana presented 7 panels at the American Circus Educators Conference in Dallas, Texas as well as attended additional educational panels.
